Annual Fundraising Events

Spring – Basket Bingo

Held at our Enola facility this is a popular spring event raising several thousand dollars annually.

Summer – Golf Tournament

Held at Cumberland Golf Course, Carlisle, PA the last Tuesday in July – this event usually generates over \$10,000 for our children.

Winter – Giving Tree

Tags are placed on a Christmas tree in the CAIU Enola lobby with children's ages, and a specific need they might have. Employees and friends of Champions for Children take the tags and purchase the items to be given to the students in time for Christmas.
